The New Zealand Curriculum Design Institute – Te Wānanga Hoahoa Mātauranga Aotearoa (NZCDI) are approved to provide modules in all 12 Teacher Aide Competency Areas identified by the Ministry of Education; 4Teacher Aide Certificates (made up of MoE approved Teacher Aide Competency areas plus 3 other certificates that enhance Teacher Aide, SENCo, Pastoral Care and Wellbeing capabilities.

Our interactive programmes are customised to your needs, evidence-based, practical, and designed to support you to achieve all Ministry of Education Teacher's Aide Competency categories overtime.

NZCDI Teacher Aide Certificates are awarded at Grade levels A, B, C and D and will help you to perform your work role more effectively.

#### Note

NZCDI Teacher Aide Certificate levels may not be related to Teacher Aide Pay Grades as Teacher Aide pay grades are awarded for a combination of factors.

#### You can study our modules in the following ways:

- Set Category PLD that has been pre-identified by the NZEI Te Riu Roa and the Ministry as being aligned with the teacher aide skills and competencies.
- Open Category PLD which has not been pre-identified in the Set Category, but which is relevant to specialist teacher aide needs. The Ministry will consider these funding applications on a case-by-case basis.
- Self-Directed Inquiry PLD based on self-directed inquiry into a topic of relevance to a teacher aide's work, which fits with the Kaupapa of the Fund, as discussed, and agreed with their supervisor. Teacher aides can apply for funded time to undertake the inquiry.

NZCDI programmes are provided nationally face to face, and through interactive online classes.

#### **Entry Criteria:**

Entry is open to all over 18 years of age for these programmes. All programmes are suited to those working in child/youth/people supporting roles. (You must however be approved if working at a school or kura currently to have your studies and training paid for by the MoE if you are a teacher aide).

#### **Application Information:**

To successfully apply, be enrolled, and funded by the MoE to undertake your selected Ministry Funded Teacher Aide PLD complete both the following two steps (they may be completed in any order but both must be completed to gain MoE PLD Teacher Aide funding for your programme.

Step 2. Seek support from senior staff to create your own personal Ministry of Education ESL Login and apply through this for your MoE Teacher Aide PLD funding and an ARN, Application Reference Number. Once you receive an email with your Application Reference Number, supply it to NZCDI as this will confirm that MoE will be paying for your module/programme.

**NOTE:** You may pay & study with us if your application for MoE funding is not successful.

#### Teacher aide PLD funding can be used for:

- Cover the fees/ costs for the PLD
- Reimbursement your school for the time required for you to participate in the PLD during work hours so that you can be paid at your normal rate
- Contribute to travel and accommodation required for you to participate in the PLD.
- O If you attend the online course/module outside of classroom hours, you can be paid at your normal rate for the required time.

#### **Start Dates:**

NZCDI will offer you a module/programme start date within 2 weeks of receiving your MoE ARN and a completed NZCDI Enrolment Form.

#### **Mode of Delivery:**

NZCDI Teacher Aide Certificates are available nationally and can be delivered face to face or via Interactive online.

### **Extra for the Experts**

For Teacher Aides, Learning Support, Pastoral Care, Wellbeing and SENCo who have already achieved the competencies in the above programmes we recommend advancing to the following:

#### Certificate in Whakatō te Reo

Acquire understandings of over sixty new Māori words and learn 20 new common sentence patterns through enjoyable activities. Also learn about Mātauranga Māori culture, history and tikanga and develop your cultural confidence. Includes fieldtrips.

#### Certificate in Learning Facilitation

(Ideal for those wishing to move toward becoming registered teachers)
This certificate introduces and practices advanced facilitation skills and activities that undertaken in education settings with children, youth and or adults. Learn to plan, implement, monitor, assess and continuously improve your capacity to support enjoyable and powerful learning.

#### Certificate in Universal Wellbeing

This certificate introduces and develops understanding of the Universal Wellbeing Model (UWM) and its dimensions and variables and other culturally based models. Learn to systematically enhance and support personal wellbeing developments, changes, and growth.

# Certificate in Pastoral Care & Wellbeing Coordination



Enrolments are now open for the above professional programme.

#### **Programme Aim**

This programme aims to empower you to conduct cross organisational student and/or staff wellbeing needs analyses, create a wellbeing monitoring platform, make whole of school/institutional/organisational strategic wellbeing plans, implement your wellbeing solutions, and evaluate outcomes whilst maintaining professional boundaries and wellbeing.

Invest in evidence-informed and whole of school/institution/organisational wellbeing enhancements and outcomes. Achieve improved engagement, achievement, inclusion, retention and equity levels and reduce absences, withdrawals and resignations. Learn to implement the latest models, research and wellbeing practices.

This programme is ideal for those with organisational responsibilities for wellbeing and/or pastoral care outcomes.

#### **Programme Content**

Programme content supported by national pastoral care/wellbeing and culturally responsive research findings. It develops understandings of the Universal Wellbeing Model, and professional conduct standards and boundaries, Professional Wellbeing Facilitator Guidelines, needs analysis, client evaluation, planning, implementation, monitoring, and evaluation of universal wellbeing in diverse settings.

#### **Entry Criteria**

Entry to this programme is open to those who can demonstrate a strong interest and experience enhancing and evaluating wellbeing. All applicants will complete an application form and will be interviewed before their programme place is confirmed. Some applicants maybe eligible for recognition of past learning.

#### **Annual Programme Start Dates**

Programme start dates: February, April, July, and October of each year or as organised.

#### **Programme Delivery**

This programme is usually delivered two hours a week via face to face or interactive online mode or through weekend/holiday intensives. Options are discussed with enrolees.
